Brookfield School Council Meeting September 24, 2019

Glynis welcomed everyone to the meeting and provided a brief overview of School Council at Brookfield.

Facility update – Richard Fillion

Bike Racks – in 2017 two bike racks had been ordered to replace the ones at the school. 1 bike rack was purchased by School Council through a grant provided by the City. The other was purchased by the school. Upon investigation Mr Fillion discovered that the School Board lost the original Work Orders for the bike racks. They have since been reissued and are back in the system.

Tree Planting – Richard provided costs for planting trees on school property. During a previous school year Vimy Oaks had approached Brookfield advising that the school had been selected as one of the schools to received Vimy Oaks. Glynis and Caroline believe there is confusion around this request for Tree Planting. Caroline will provide the council meeting notes where this was discussed. Action: Caroline Peck to pull minutes re: Vimy Tree and provide to Tracy

Update no notes – it might not have been a meeting that Caroline had taken the minutes of. Email sent to Tracy & Glynis.

Microwaves – Richard provided a status of the microwaves in the cafeteria and that it could be possible to add a 3rd microwave. Purchasing another microwave would have to follow the same procedure as previously – tenure.

He did advise that one of the microwaves was missing its rotating plate. Action: Ms Shapiro will find out if the plate is still missing

Picnics tables – discussion about adding additional picnic tables on school property. Concern about adding garabage cans as they can attract wasps therefore there needs to be awareness for staff and students alike. Location discussed and the cost associated to obtaining picnic tables.

The Fire Alarm has been update.

Some of the doors in the school have been updated to be accessibile.

Next summer the flooring will be replaced with Laminate

Principal Report – Tracy Shapiro

Enrollement

In May the school was projecting 550 and now the school is at 570.

Final enrollments numbers will go in next Monday. Based on this number the number of sections will go up. Looking at 7 sections mostly in ESL and History and will most likely occur in 2nd semester. Right now Grade 11 is the tightest grade.

There have been a lot of staffing changes. 14 new teachers have started in September with the biggest change being in Guidance. Head of Guidance is Derek Eyamie & Brooke Pioier is the second in guidance. Now students, and parents, can sign up for guidance appointments on-line

There is a Board wide Leadership Camp and 3 students from Brookfield will be attending.

Friday is the Terry Fox Run and the school is looking for donations. Donations can even be done on line. The goal for this year is to raise \$2000.00.

Next Monday is Orange Shirt Day to recongize residential schools

On October 17th Eva Olsen will be at the school to give a presentation on Hate, Intolerance and Hope.

Prinicpal Review Discussion

Tracy shared the Prinicpal Review that had been previously done. The purpose of the Prinicpal Review is to review the position of the Principal at Brookfield.

School Council is to review the Prinicpal Review, make any changes and return to Tracy. Then the Prinicpal Review is returned to the School Board. This has to be completed by the end of October.

As the review is to be done every year it was suggest that we review the Principal Review for Brookfield at our next meeting.

Other Business

There are 130 ESL students. 78 of these are International Students.

The school also has two other programs running the ASD Program Autism Spectrum Disabilities (20 central place) and the LD Program – Learning Disabilities

Note there was 1 ASD Program last year but a 2nd ASD Program was added this year.

Fund Raising

Glynis provided an overview of what Fundraising activities have occured in the school. For example, the music program does citrus fruit, Prom is currently fundraising cookie *dough (orders are being taken now and email was sent out.)* Was order form attached?

Action Item – Ms Shapiro

No Order Form was attached – confirmed by Izzie attending meeting. Only instructions on how to pay – cash....

There was a discussion around the possibility that Council could do a fund raiser for the school. Perhaps for Christmas? To aid in the purchase of microwave or picnic tables?

Possible Fund Raising campaigns - Epicure, Cards Gift Wrapping etc, Chocolates etc.

Reusable Bags - Mr Fillion suggested that with the new law coming in for plastic bags perhaps we could look into Resuable Bags with Brookfield logo on it.

Note that there are Funds that do come into the school. The school does receive \$500 from the School Board. And last year we also did a Pro Grant which provides the school with \$1000.00. Other Fundraising in the school:

Carolyn mentioned that Music is doing Fun Script? There is the Pancake Breakfast for the Veterans. As well as Inside Ride which raises funds for cancer.

Can we get a wish list from staff on their needs. Tracy is not aware of a Wish List but it is something to investigate.

Last year Greg Goforth had made a request for computers for 1 of the computer labs.

Regarding computers –the school will be down to 1 computer lab come January due to upgrades that the Board IT Security department is doing. Over the course of the past year the computers have been upgraded. The school is schedule to receive more computers next *September*.

Note: Chrome Books are also being surplused as well.

Izzie Berish – Perhaps if School Council is to Fund Raise we whould really have a goal to start from.

It was suggested that we ask the Teachers & the Students to come back with a wish list. *Action Ms Shapiro & Salma*.

Prom

This year the school will be holding a School Sanctioned Prom. This means it is a "dry" prom. 2 police officers are on site and fund raising can occur on school property. There are lots of benefits to doing a school sanctioned for the students.

If the Prom is not School Sanctioned then the students have no support from the school and they must do everything on their own including holding the funds. In these situations the students work with a 3rd Party

promoter/event coordinator. There have been issues with these 3rd Party event coordinators over the years with other schools.

Cell Phones

What is Brookfield doing about the Governments rule regarding cell phone. Ms Shapiro explained the ruling.

Guidance Office new scheduling system

Could Tracy confirm that the Guidance Councilors are in fact using the new system for appointments in the Guidance Office. It appears Guidance Councillors are not aware of their apporinments and which student they are to be meeting with. It would appear 1 system for students and parents and another system for the councillors.

Action: Tracy will investigateit

Link Crew

What is Link Crew? It is a program for Grade 11 & 12 students to mentor Grade 9 students. Students selected for Link Crew do receive a Grade U credit for this. Activites involve Orientation Day, as well as academic and social follow-up activites throughout the year. Link Crew participants gain Leadership skills, Research and Inquiry skills and Presentation and Speaking skills just to name a few.

Izzie Berize would like to congratulate all staff and this year's Link Rrew for making the Grade 9s feel so welcome. There has been a lot of positive feedack from grade 9s so far.

It should be noted that when the applications and interviews take place in the Spring for Link Crew that even shy kids can be very good mentors and should be considered. Salma did confirm that shy students have been selected in the past as Link Crew Leaders.
